1. Ms. Chris Nichols called the meeting to order.

2. Ms. Chris Nichols declared a quorum.

**3**. Mr. Derrell Cohoon moved to approve the agenda, Mr. Chenevert seconded and the agenda was approved.

**4**. Ms. Verni Howard moved to approve the July 10, 2012 minutes, Mr. Derrell Cohoon seconded and the minutes were approved.

Rev. Brad Franklin, assistant pastor at First United Methodist Church, shared a few words of wisdom. Mr. Davis Rhorer thanked Woman's Club for hosting the meeting and introduced Ms. Jackie Krueger welcomed everyone to the Woman's Club and introduced Ms. Nell Mitchell Doughty briefed the Commission on the history of the facility.

## 5. Board Action – No board action.

**6a.** Governmental Issues – Riverfront Development – The Commission viewed, via PowerPoint, images of proposed implementation projects. Mr. Davis Rhorer informed the Commission that the Metropolitan Council approved the budget supplement action items on the following projects:

- Lafayette Street / Streetscape improvements \$200,000
- Wayfinding in North Blvd. Town Square \$30,000
- Riverfront Gateway improvements I-110 Interstate to Mississippi River \$100,000
- Lighting for the canopy structure \$50,000

Mr. Rhorer congratulated Mayor Holden on receiving the Louisiana Municipal Association award for the North Blvd. Town Square.

6b. Development Initiatives - Downtown Greenway Update - The Commission viewed, via PowerPoint, an aerial photograph indicating the boundaries of the proposed greenway. Mayor Holden thanked the Woman's Club for hosting the meeting and informed the Commission that today is the Spirit of 45', observance to honor our World War II veterans. Mayor Holden commended everyone involved with the development downtown. Mayor Holden announced that the greenway project has been awarded \$1,144,547 million in Transportation, Community and System Preservation Program (TCSP) funds for implementation. The project is a functional green network of pedestrian bike paths. The grant will help connect North Boulevard Town Square with the planned greenway along I-110 via the North Boulevard Promenade - a multi-use pathway that will be constructed in the median under the beautiful North Boulevard Live Oaks. The connection is a very important piece in the overall greenway concept that plans to connect 7 BREC parks and neighborhoods along the greenway with LSU, Downtown, and the levee bike path. Mayor Holden commended the federal highway administration for their assistance with this grant. The TCSP grant award, along with numerous other successful grant applications, will bring the total dollars for construction to \$3 million. NBTS is receiving awards and the project is not complete. Mayor Holden expressed the need to compliment the businesses and offices that have committed to downtown. Mr. Rhorer reviewed the aerial indicating the boundaries of the proposed greenway and thanked East Baton Rouge Mortgage Finance Authority for agreeing to assist with the funding of the planning of the Downtown Greenway.

**Florida Street and River Rd. Levee Access / LASM Improvements** – The Commission viewed, via PowerPoint, an aerial image indicating the area for improvements and proposed renderings. Mr. Rhorer informed the Commission that federal funds are being used for phase one of the gateway at Florida Street and River Rd. Levee access. The gateway will be designed in house by the Department of Public Works with assistance by Washer Hill Lipscomb Cabaniss Architecture. The LASM plaza area will be designed by Suzanne Turner and Associates. The plan proposes a bike trail head access at River Rd. and Florida.

**Repentance Park Update** – The Commission viewed, via PowerPoint, a photograph of the current construction site. Mr. Gabe Vicknair briefed the Commission on how the project will enhance the pedestrian flow from Repentance Park to the NBTS. The project is on schedule for the projected completion date of November 2012.

**BREC Convention Street Park Update** – The Commission viewed, via PowerPoint, an image of the rendering and photographs of the current construction site. Ms. Carolyn McKnight, BREC Superintendent, expressed her excitement to be involved in the downtown park and commended the DDD on the proposed greenway. Mr. Reed Richard briefed the Commission on the design of the Convention Street Park and expressed that the park will be a complement to the other projects downtown. The completion date has been extended to early October 2012.

**CATS** – The Commission viewed, via PowerPoint, an image of the Touchdown Express flyer. Each Commissioner received a copy of the press release. Ms. Vanisia Winston, CATS, informed the Commission that CATS will provide a game day shuttle "Touchdown Express" for the LSU home games

at a cost of \$4.00 per round trip. The shuttle begins 4 hours before the game and 1 hour after the game. Ms. Winston thanked the DDD for their assistance with the service. Following are the locations you can purchase tickets and catch the shuttle:

Each Commissioner received a copy of the newspaper articles Mr. Michael Lang expressed his excitement to be a part of the continued development downtown and informed the Commission that he will be serving as the local development lead for developer T. J. Iarocci. Mr. Lang commended Vision City for their assistance with the transaction of the building. Mr. Lang informed the Commission that downtown stakeholders will be invited to attend a charette that will be scheduled for late fall 2012. The plans for the building are in the preliminary stages but will include residential, retail space and possible a rooftop venue.

**Grocery Store Survey** – Mr. Rhorer informed the Commission that the DDD will be sending out a Grocery Store survey later this week. Mr. Rhorer encouraged everyone to participate in the survey.
